Treasurer Report

Bank balance as of Dec. 30 -- \$14,104.51 (We added \$1,453 to our bank balance since last month)
Income for December was \$2,651.18 (\$260.18 from dues, \$1,464 from calendars, and \$927 from Farmers Market raffle and vendor fees)

Expenses for December were \$1,318.24 (\$63.24 for parade float decorations and candy, \$120.40 for Farmers Market, \$252.29 for dog park maintenance and \$882.31 for calendars)

Net profit for the Dec. 17 Farmers Market was \$806 (still need to pay TPT tax, approx \$60)--see attached

Net profit for 2026 calendars was \$581

31 households have paid their dues for 2026
